The Process

- 1. YouTube account
- 2. Upload video to YouTube
- 3. Review and edit auto-captions
- 4. Share video with students
 - Closed captions
 - Transcript

Best Practices – YouTube Account

- Review and adjust "Privacy Settings"
- Review and adjust "Defaults"
 - Privacy: Public/Private/Unlisted
 - *Category*: Education (if nothing else)
 - *License*: Standard YouTube/Creative Commons
- Review and edit auto-captions, always!
- Respect copyright



Best Practices – Audio/Video

- Record in a quiet environment
- Use a good quality microphone
- Start with a script
- Be clear, be brief
- Review and edit auto captions
- Provide transcript
